Resources, evaluations, equipment access and programming, and therapeutic instruction are available. Clients are paired with graduate student clinicians studying speech-language pathology at Iowa.

- cerebral palsy
- progressive neurogenic disorders
- low-incidence disorders
- severe apraxia of speech
- traumatic brain injury
- intellectual disabilities
