

LANGUAGE & LITERACY CLUB

Children entering grades 2-6 in Fall 2022 (ages 7-11) with a goal of improving reading skills are invited to join our summer reading club through the Wendell Johnson Speech and Hearing Clinic at the University of Iowa in Iowa City.

What's the Language & Literacy Club?

It's a program where children work on their knowledge of sounds, letters, units of word meaning, vocabulary, and grammar through fun and interactive group activities. Participants are encouraged to bring their own thematic reading material to read in each session!

When does the club meet?

It will start Summer 2022 on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons in June and July. Specific start and end dates are based on family and clinician availability. Academic year extension programming will be available.



What else should I know?

Groups will be facilitated by graduate student clinicians under the supervision of an experienced, certified speech-language pathologist.

Spaces are limited, and children will be chosen based on fit with other group members.

Fees are assessed at the low group therapy rate of \$30 per session. Insurance is accepted, and a sliding fee scale is available for families who qualify.

Is the Language and Literacy Club right for my child?

The program is designed for those who:

Have primary challenges related to reading and language

Are able to engage in instruction and discussion about reading concepts

Can select reading material that is of interest to them

Are able to attend to and participate in group activities for 90 minutes

Participate in a general education classroom for the majority of their day at school

Wish to attend and participate and will maintain consistent attendance

Have parents or caregivers who will attend brief weekly trainings and support participants in at-home activities
