# CURRENT RESEARCH NEARING COMPLETION AT U OF I DEPT. OF COMMUNICOLOGY

The Chairman of the Speech Pathology Dept. has been awarded a non-renewable, non-refundable grant by the NIH to study the production of orally generated nonspeech sounds. According to the grant application, a secondary purpose of the proposed research will be to determine listeners' reactions to such sounds.

Hugalett Morris has devised a new speech clipping device which will be of considerable interest to stutterers. Upon the initial unveiling of the device to Boye Institute Morris demonstrated by speaking into the microphone, "Hu-Hu-Hu-Hugh M-M-Mo-Morris" and, miracle of miracles, the output from the device was Hugh Morris.
