



detail. Remember that disagreement is itself one of the norms of academia. Indeed, most scholarly reputations are made disagreeing with the right colleagues at the right time. Flatter your professors, but never in direct, clumsy fashion. E.g., never say: "Hey, professor, that was a good article you wrote in the micromesian Journal of Politics." Rather, say something like: "Why don't you write a rejoinder to X and put him in his place?" or "Y really made an ass of himself in his review of your book."

Remember that a good letter of recommendation from a senior professor when you seek out your first full-time job is worth a couple of hundred hours of slave labor. And if it makes you feel

better, call it good experience.
